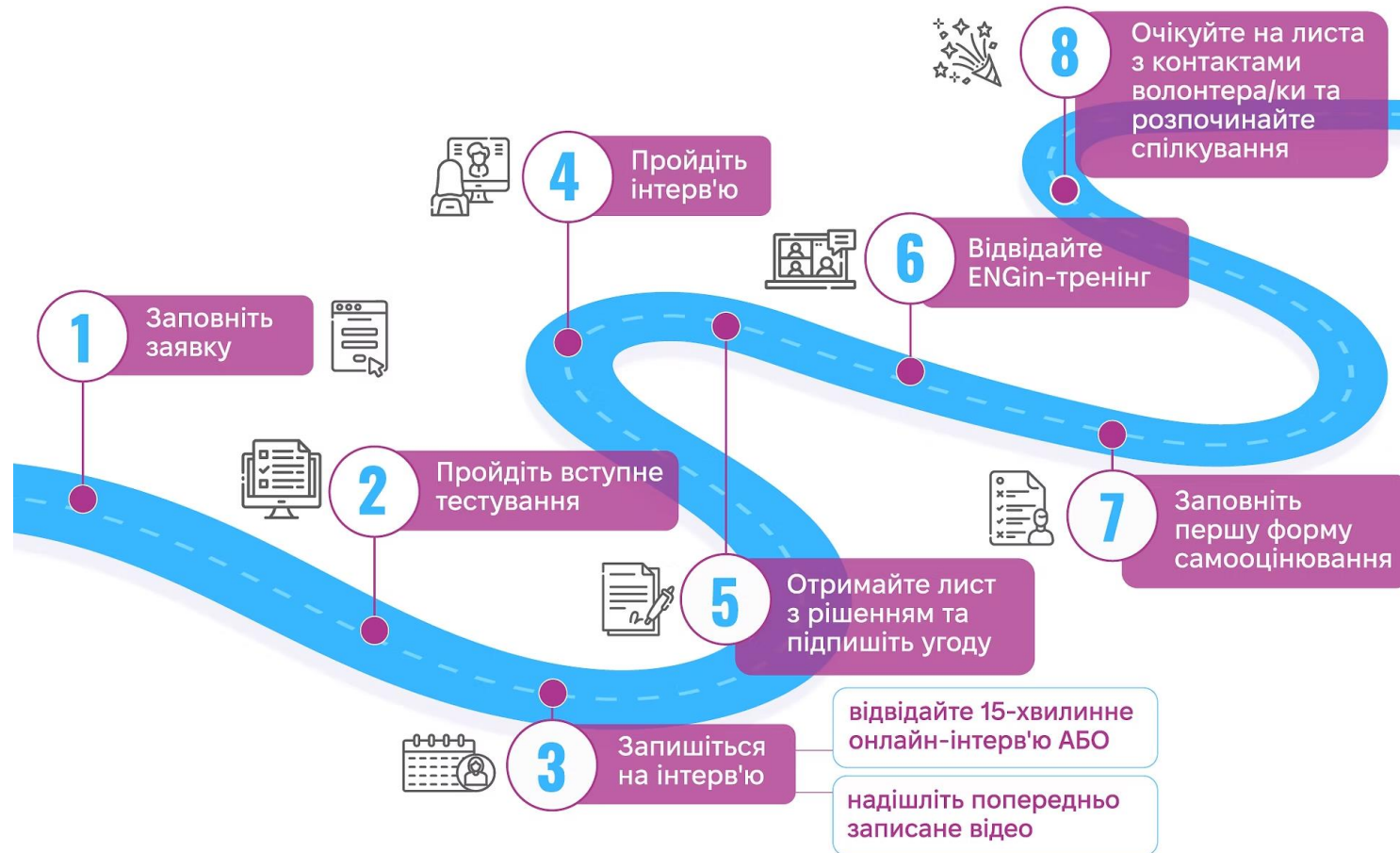


□ ENGIN is an international nonprofit organization that helps Ukrainians improve their English-speaking skills through online conversations with volunteers from around the world.

- Discussing different topics
- Building confidence step by step
